PE tops

We are in the process of sourcing new PE tops for all our pupils which will replace the coloured T-shirts. School will provide each pupil with a new shirt initially. The new PE tops will

Home time arrangements

With the change of classrooms has come a great proportion of parents accessing the right hand side of the main school through the narrow gates. In order to alleviate some of this congestion we will send older pupils with siblings in year 2 through the hall to meet parents on the main playground.

If parents with children in years 4 and 5 could walk round to the smaller playground by the forest and wait and year 3 parents wait outside the double doors (next to the year 3 classroom windows), then hopefully this will ease the pinch point by the gates. Year 6 children will be sent directly through their classroom door, so if parents collecting year 6 children could wait there or on the donkey path, that would be appreciated.

Pupils in years 5 and 6 are allowed to walk home by themselves, but we do need a letter, email or note in the reading diary giving permission for this to happen. Many pupils walking home now carry phones for safety reasons and this is wholly supported by the school. However, if your child is bringing a phone into school, then it must be handed in to Miss Eden in the office first thing in the morning and collected at home time.
