Back to School Reminders

Uniform

It has been wonderful to see the children return to school looking so smart, especially when wearing the new PE tops. Please remember if you are entitled to pupil premium funding then school will help with the cost of uniform. In order to maintain this high standard of presentation, please adhere to our policy of:

- No jewellery should be worn (stud earrings only exception)
- No nail polish
- Hair accessories in green please
- Black shoes (not trainers) on non PE days

Free School Meals

Even though all infant children (reception, year 1 and year 2) are entitled to universal free school meals, we strongly advise parents to still apply and claim for free school meals if entitled. As a school we can claim additional funding for pupils entitled to pupil premium. This funding is used to support the purchasing of school uniform, subsidising school trips as well as paying for music lessons.
