I continue to be amazed at how well our reception pupils are settling in to life 'at big school' and a huge

All the other classes have also settled into the new academic year beautifully, especially the year one pupils who are now at the main school. It is lovely having them in the main school building and watching them interact with our older pupils.



Our reception pupils have already started our phonic scheme 'Read, Write Inc' and there will be a meeting for reception parents at 5.30pm on Tuesday the 22nd of October in the main school hall.

During this meeting, you will learn exactly how we teach our youngest pupils to read. Please do your best to attend this meeting as it will give you all the necessary information of how you can best support your child whilst they are learning to read. 79% of reception pupils met the Early Learning Goal in reading last year and 96% passed the phonics screening check in Year One. These figures are above the national average and could not have been achieved without parental support. As children get older and read more fluently, they are able to take far more responsibility for their own learning, particularly in reading. As reading for a minimum of four times a week is part of our homework policy, we do ask that you ensure that your child is fulfilling this part of their homework as currently we do have a number of

children who are struggling to get back into this vital habit. Thank you for your anticipated support with this matter.
