### **School Dinners**

The cost of a school dinner will be increasing to £2.80 a day from April 1st. This increase is being applied across the Trust and the decision has been made after continual increases in food prices and staff wages. Thank you for your understanding.



# Attendance

Everybody wants children to be safe and get a good education. This means they should attend school regularly unless they are ill. The government and local authority (Cheshire East) take children's attendance at school very seriously.

It is important to let the school know on the first morning of illness that your child will not be attending school that day.

If your child is absent for 10 or more unauthorised sessions (a session is half a day) within a term or two consecutive terms you may get a penalty notice warning letter. The letter will give you a period of 15 days in which to improve the child's attendance.

If there is no improvement in attendance within the 15 days then you will receive a school absence penalty notice which would result in a fine. You will receive a separate penalty notice for each child who has been absent.

The fine is £60 per child for each parent/carer with parental responsibility. If the fine is not paid within 21 days then the fine rises to £120 per child.

If the fine is not paid within 28 days you could be taken to court. You could get a criminal record and you may be fined up to £1,000.

If you take your child out of school in term time without the head teacher's permission you may also receive a penalty notice (fine).

If you as a parent are worried about your child's attendance you should speak to the school. The school wants to work with you to improve your child's attendance. Don't wait until the situation escalates, the school can offer practical ideas and support to help your child.







I have advertised in many newsletters that the Government made changes to the laws regarding school attendance in August 2024 and parental fines for unauthorised absences have now been brought in under a national framework.

I have included the guidance here (on left), so that all parents are clear about unauthorised absences and when, not if, fines will be issued.

The legislation is clear that time off can only be authorised by a headteacher if the circumstances are exceptional. An exceptional circumstance is defined as 'a one-off event which is unavoidable.' Head teachers cannot authorise term time holidays, therefore we have removed the 'authorised/ unauthorised' section on the holiday request form.

I have always tried to work with parents regarding absence and hope that together we can continue to improve our overall attendance figure. Whilst we are in line with national figures, I would dearly like us to be higher.
