SATs, phonics and other results

Our children know that test results are not 'the be all and end all' for us at Highfields, as long as they have done their best they will have made us proud. That said, we firmly believe that all pupils should reach their true potential during their time here. Being a competent and confident reader as well as achieving the expected levels in the core subjects, does place pupils in a good position, both for high school and for later life. Results in reading have steadily risen over the past four years and this year we achieved well above the national average in the key stage 2 SATs tests, with 41% of pupils meeting the greater depth standard. We have also been consistently above the national average in the Phonics Screening Check for the past three years, and these results show our commitment to reading. I was thrilled at results in all tests this years, and whilst my belief will always be that children need a broad and balanced curriculum, I also believe literacy and numeracy should be firmly embedded. The results below would not be possible without a highly skilled and dedicated team of teachers and support staff and I am so proud to lead such a fantastic team.

Accelerated Reader


On this year's Parent Survey, some parents asked to know more about the Accelerated reader system, so I will do my best to summarise this programme.

Accelerated Reader asks pupils to complete a Star reading test on the computer. This test tests understanding of vocabulary within a given context. A reading age and a 'zone of proximal development (ZPD) are then generated from the results. This is the range we ask your children to read within as we know the books within that range are perfectly pitched in terms of challenge and appropriate content. When children have read a book, they should complete a quiz within 24 hours. Quizzes passed count towards a child's word count.

Pupils complete a star reading test each half term so that we can check that their ZPD is still appropriate and measure progress. It is usual that results fluctuate from test to test, but as long as the overall trajectory is going in the 'right direction' there is nothing to worry about.
