WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

Just your favourite colours!

are all great for this!

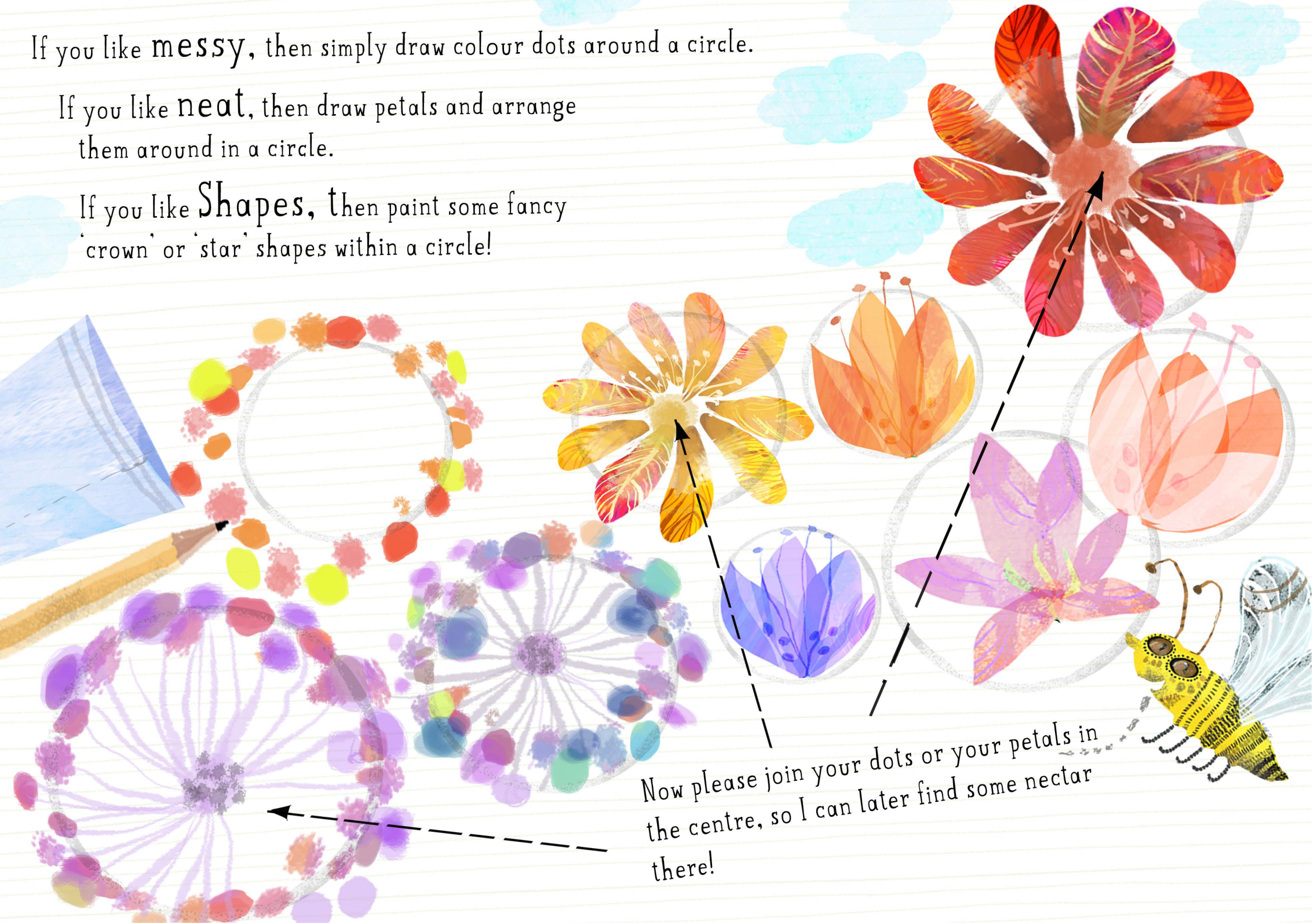
And maybe a

If you like **messy**, then simply draw colour dots around a circle.

If you like **neat**, then draw petals and arrange them around in a circle.

If you like **Shapes**, then paint some fancy 'crown' or 'star' shapes within a circle!



Now please join your dots or your petals in the centre, so I can later find some nectar there!

- Now give each flower:
1. A stem to grow tall with.
 2. Green leaves to store the energy from the sun.
 3. A root system or a bulb to absorb water and minerals from the earth.



For your blooms to thrive you'll need to now paint or draw these three very important things:

1. Plenty of **sunlight**!

2. **Water**! Enough, but not too much!

3. Good **soil**, the kind that worms like!

So add your favourites: Butterflies, snails, ladybirds, bees, slugs and beetles will all be attracted to your blooms!
